For seven centuries, the Grimaldi family has ruled the Principality. In the Prince's Palace, you can discover the beauty and splendour of the State Apartments and take a journey through the centuries, from the Renaissance to the Napoleonic era. Built on the site of a Genoese fortress in 1215, the Prince's Palace contains a thousand treasures, such as the "Cour d'Honneur" (the main courtyard), and the majestic, double-revolution staircase leading to the Hercule Gallery and State Apartments. At precisely 11.55 am each day on the Place du Palais, spectators can see the unique, unchanging ritual of the Changing of the Palace Guard.

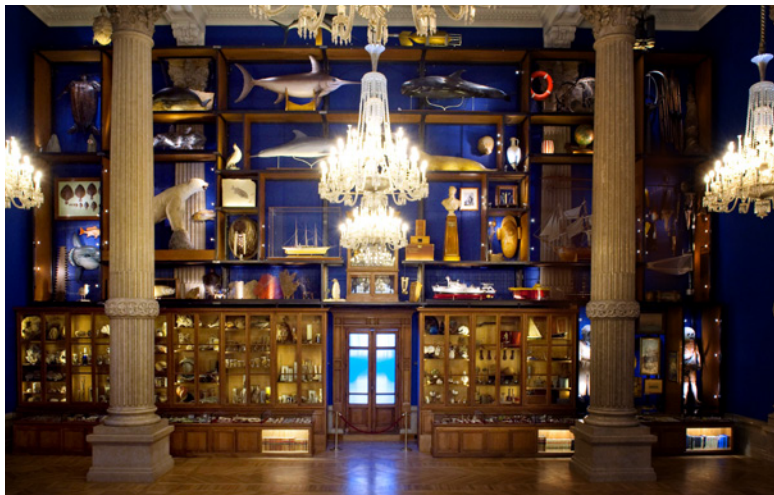
FOUNDATION FRANCIS BACON | B

The Francis Bacon MB Art Foundation is based in Monaco. This not-for-profit institution devotes its studies and its research activities to Francis Bacon, one of the most enigmatic English figurative artists of the 20th century.

The foundation is open to art researchers and historians, and to the general public, all year round. A guided tour takes visitors on a journey through the works, life and working methods of Francis Bacon, paying particular attention to the period during which he lived and worked in Monaco and in France.



THE MONACO OCEANOGRAPHIC MUSEUM & AQUARIUM^{1c}



Built on the side of the legendary Monaco rock, the Oceanographic Museum has watched over the oceans for over a century. Founded by Prince Albert I, great-great-grandfather of H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco, it was designed as a palace completely devoted to Art and Science.

Towering 85 metres above the waves, it invites visitors to discover over 6000 specimens in their spectacular underwater environment.

Centre of exchange and culture, it deals with the issues surrounding the protection of the oceans, humanity's common heritage.

From aquariums to historic collections, including the Shark Lagoon and Turtle Island on the panoramic terrace, the Museum offers a unique opportunity to know, love and protect the oceans.

VILLA PALOMA

NEW NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MONACO (NMNM)

Villa Paloma was constructed in the 1910s and remains one of the most beautiful patrician residences in the Principality. Its stained-glass windows were made by Master Glazier Fassi Cadet of Nice. The New National Museum of Monaco has been organising temporary exhibitions there since 2010.

The Villa's Antique-style garden, designed by Octave Godard, a pupil of the famous landscape gardener Edouard André (1840-1911), offers an outstanding view of the Principality. Many works are exhibited there, including folding house by Jean Pascal Flavien since 2016.

NEW NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MONACO (NMNM)

Villa Sauber is one of the last remaining Belle Époque villas in Monaco. It is said to have been designed by Charles Garnier, because of the similarities with the opera house constructed at the same time. The artist Robert Sauber purchased the villa in 1904, then it became the property of the Monegasque state in 1969. The New National Museum of Monaco was home to the Galéa Collection (dolls, automatons, miniatures, etc.) from 1972 to 2009.

The gardens of Villa Sauber feature citrus trees, a rose garden dedicated to Francis Meilland, and more historical tropical plants. The New National Museum of Monaco organises temporary exhibitions at Villa Sauber.

H.S.H. THE PRINCE'S COLLECTION OF VINTAGE CARS | F

Prince Rainier III was a real car fan. At the end of the 1950s he began a collection of vintage cars. As time went by, acquisitions were made and the collection grew. The garage at the Royal Palace became too small to accommodate one hundred wonderful vehicles, some monumental, some sporty, with their majestic bodywork, gleaming bonnets and regal radiator grids. So in 1993, Prince Rainier III decided to share his treasures with the public.

A totally unique exhibition area of 5,000m² located on the Terrasses de Fontvieille is home to almost one hundred cars: from a 1903 DE DION BOUTON to a 2013 LOTUS F1, via great names such as HISPANO SUIZA, ROLLS ROYCE, LINCOLN, FACEL VEGA, DELAGE, DELAHAYE, PACKARD, HUMBER, NAPIER, FERRARI, MASERATI, LAMBORGHINI, ALFA ROMEO and the LEXUS from the Prince's wedding in 2011. The collection also features racing cars that marked the Monte-Carlo Rally and the Monaco F1 Grand Prix.

OBSERVATORY CAVE AND THE MUSEUM OF PREHISTORIC ANTHROPOLOGY

A view looking down on Monaco and the coast of the Italian and French Riviera, an abundance of unusual “succulent” plants that the visitor discovers along the paths clinging to the cliffs, a cave where stalactites, stalagmites, draperies and concretions have been formed over millennia and a museum that explores the origins of life... ARCHITECTURAL HERITAGE

IN MONTE-CARLO THE CASINO

Built in 1878 by Charles Garnier, who added the Opera House, identical to the one in Paris, the building is a jewel of the “Belle Epoque”.

L'HÔTEL DE PARIS

Inaugurated in 1864, the hotel has been altered and refurbished many times and today combines the charm of palaces of yesteryear with modern standards of comfort.

L'HÔTEL HERMITAGE

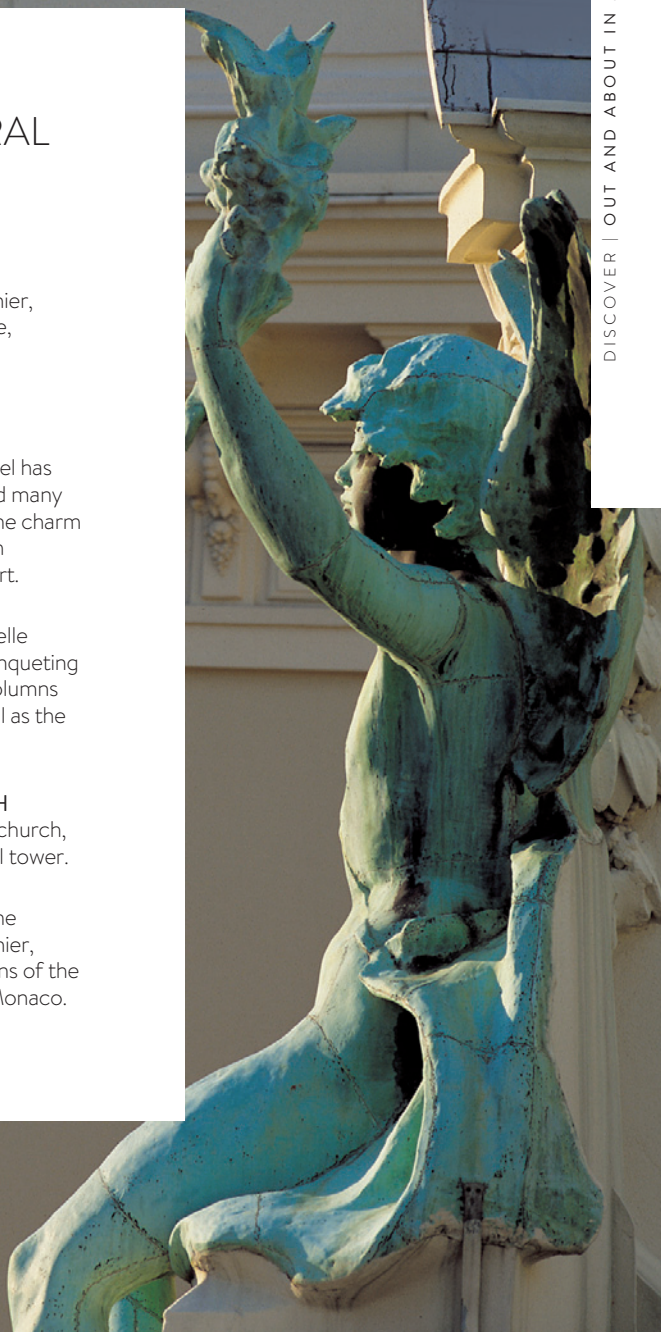
Built in 1900 in the purist “Belle Epoque” style, it boasts a banqueting hall featuring rose marble columns and a frescoed ceiling as well as the Winter Garden with a dome designed by Gustave Eiffel.

SAINT-CHARLES CHURCH

A French Renaissance style church, it has a thirty-metre high bell tower.

LA VILLA SAUBER

Constructed at the end of the 19th Century by Charles Garnier, the villa houses the exhibitions of the New National Museum of Monaco.





ON THE ROCK THE PRINCE'S PALACE

Constructed on the site of a Genoese fortress in 1215, the Palace was modified during the Renaissance.

THE CATHEDRAL

It was built in white stone from La Turbie between 1875 and 1884 in the reign of Prince Charles III in Neo-classical style.

OCEANOGRAPHIC MUSEUM

It took eleven years of work and one hundred thousand tons of stone from La Turbie to build the museum, which was inaugurated by its founder, Prince Albert I, in 1910.

PALAIS DE JUSTICE

Inaugurated in 1930, the Palais de Justice was built in solid tuff, a grey, porous rock - the same rock used to build the ramparts.

THE CHAPEL OF MERCY

Built with only one nave, its first stone was blessed in 1639 in the reign of Prince Honoré I.

FORT ANTOINE

Built at the beginning of the 18th century, destroyed in 1944 and rebuilt in 1953 on the initiative of Prince Rainier III, the fort is now an open-air theatre.

IN LA CONDAMINE SAINTE-DEVOTE CHURCH

Dating from the 11th Century, the church is dedicated to the patron saint of the Principality and the royal family.

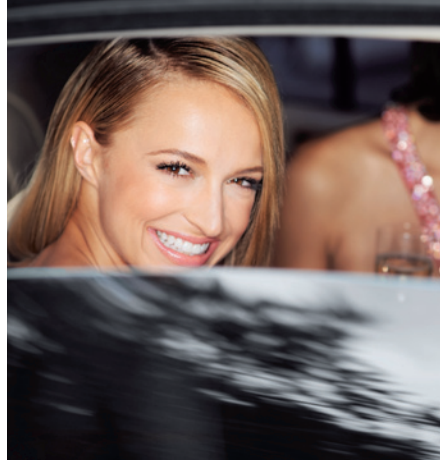

BOUTIQUES & SHOPPING AREAS

IN MONTE-CARLO

The greatest luxury brands are to be found in the boutiques of the Cercle d'Or and the Park Palace Gallery in the streets around the Casino.

Le Métropole shopping centre has a choice of eighty boutiques, including the FNAC.

You will also find various luxury shops in the Boulevard des Moulins, the Avenue Saint-Charles and the Avenue Princesse Grace.

ON THE ROCK

A wide range of local souvenirs is on sale in the fifty or so shops spread around Monaco's historic centre.

IN LA CONDAMINE

In this typical area not far from Port Hercule, nearly two hundred shops are located around the market, Rue Grimaldi, Rue Princesse Caroline and the Jardins d'Apolline shopping gallery.

IN FONTVIEILLE

In the Fontvieille shopping centre, you will find nearly forty shops near the Carrefour superstore.

There are also various shops and restaurants along the port.

MARKETS

All the colours and flavours of the South are on display at the La Condamine (Place d'Armes) market, from Monday to Sunday from 7am to 3pm, and its «Halle Gourmande» from Tuesday to Saturday between 6pm and 9.30pm as well as the Monte Carlo market (Avenue Saint-Charles), open to external traders every day, 6am-2pm.





BETWEEN THE SEA AND THE MOUNTAINS

EXCURSIONS

Starting point for many excursions along the coast or into the hinterland, Monaco is ideally placed for exploring the Italian and French Riviera.

WALKS

From Monte-Carlo Beach to Cap Martin

A walk along a picturesque path overlooking the sea. On the way, you can see Le Corbusier's cabin. There and back: 3 hours. Suitable for jogging.

From Monte-Carlo Beach to Monaco Port

A walk by the sea on the promenade along the Larvotto beaches, crossing the gardens that stretch from the Grimaldi Forum to the Boulevard Louis II and finishing at Port Hercule. Around 40 min.

From Fontvieille to Cap d'Ail (Mala beach)

The path is lined with "Belle Epoque" dwellings. The walker can learn about Mediterranean flora thanks to informative notice boards.

There and back: 3 hours.

Suitable for jogging.

The Via Alpina,

Its many paths connect the Principality to Trieste in Italy. In Monaco, the itinerary starts at the Place du Palais, passes through the Saint-Martin Gardens and Avenue de la Porte Neuve, crosses the Place d'Armes and arrives at the Exotic Garden before continuing to La Turbie...

HALF-DAY EXCURSIONS

Beausoleil | 1

This little town on the border with Italy has many examples of "Belle Epoque" architecture, in particular, the Riviera Palace (visit to the glass roof designed by Eiffel, on request). There is also a panoramic view of Italy, Cap Martin and the Principality. 3 km

Roquebrune-Village | 2

Formerly part of Monaco, the village is famous for its 10th Century fortified castle and mediaeval centre. 6 km

La Turbie | 3

This ancient village in the “Comté de Nice”, is the site of the “Trophée des Alpes” (Tropaeum Alpium), a Roman work of art. 8 km

Èze-Village | 4

Perched on a rocky peak, this fortified village offers an outstanding view of the Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat peninsula. 10 km

Menton | 5

The town is famous for its magnificent gardens (Palais Carnolés, Val Rameh, Villa Maria Serena, Fontana Rosa...) and art, notably, the Jean Cocteau Museum. 10 km

Sainte-Agnès | 6

At 780 metres above sea level, the highest coastal village in Europe is classified as one of the most beautiful villages in France. Visit to Fort Maginot. 21 km

Beaulieu-sur-Mer | 7

The rich architectural heritage of the town includes the Villa Kerylos, built in 1902, with the atmosphere of a palace from Antiquity. 11 km

Villefranche-sur-Mer | 8

This is a popular destination, with the 16th Century Saint-Elme Citadel, which overlooks the harbour and Saint-Pierre Chapel, decorated by Jean Cocteau. 14 km

Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat | 9

This peninsula lends itself to walks. Must see: the Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild. 13 km

Nice | 10

Stroll through this colourful town on the shores of a legendary bay, from the Promenade des Anglais to the amphitheatre in Cimiez, and through the market in the Cours Saleya to the Chateau hill and Park Phoenix. 18 km.



FULL-DAY EXCURSIONS

The Italian Riviera | 11

First, soak up the lively atmosphere of the Friday Ventimiglia market. Then head for San Remo, capital of the “Riviera dei Fiori”. 22 km

Vallée de la Roya Bévéra | 12

Sospel, Breil-sur-Roya, Saorge, Fontan, La Brigue, Tende...

You can discover around fifteen religious monuments in the villages on this Baroque itinerary. 30-50 km.

Haut-de-Cagnes | 13

Looking down over Cagnes-sur-Mer, this mediaeval village houses the Grimaldi Castle & Museum and the Renoir Museum. 30 km.

Vence and Saint-Paul-de-Vence | 14

In the first village, you can see the Chapel of the Rosary, decorated by Matisse, the Notre-Dame-des-Fleurs Chateau and the “Musée du Parfum et de la Liqueur”. In the second, you can stroll through numerous galleries and visit the “Fondation Maeght”. 40 km.

Antibes | 15

To see: Fort Carré, the Vauban ramparts, the Picasso Museum and Marineland amusement park. 40 km

Biot | 16

Experience the world of glass making in the numerous workshops. Pay a visit to the Fernand Léger Museum. 42 km.

Cannes | 17

The town is the stuff of dreams, with its Croisette, Palais des Festivals and picturesque old town, le Suquet. It is the departure point for excursions to the Îles de Lérins opposite – Île Sainte-Marguerite where the Man in the Iron Mask was imprisoned and Île Saint-Honorat and its monastery. 50 km

Vallauris | 18

The village is famous for its pottery and ceramic workshops and its Picasso Museum. 51 km

Grasse | 19

Immerse yourself in the history of Provence in the perfume town, with the Museum of the Art and History of Provence and in the life of the famous painter with the Villa Fragonard. Don't miss the many perfumeries. 56 km

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Day buses (lines 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6)

“La Compagnie des Autobus de Monaco” operates services on six bus routes that cover every area in the Principality.

They run every ten minutes (except routes 3 and 5) during the week and every twenty minutes on Saturday and Sunday, from around 7 am to 9.30 pm.

Evening and night (N) buses

There is a bus route that serves the entire Principality every night from 9.20pm to 0.20am, leaving every thirty minutes and taking approximately forty-five minutes from start to finish. On Fridays and Saturdays the service is extended with 4 additional buses leaving at: 1am, 2am, 3am and 4am.

Electric boat bus

The boat bus operates a service across the Port Hercule between 8 am and 7.50 pm, every twenty minutes. Boarding is at the Quai des États-Unis or the Quai Rainier 1^{er}.
